Almonds

Almond All-In-One Standard (mccyalall)

Nemaguard Deciduous tree.

Moderate growth to 12 to 15 feet with a 10 to 12 foot spread. Single white flowers in early spring are followed by a heavy crop of soft shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. This is the best almond for home orchards, because of superior flavor and the fact that All-In-One is self-pollinating. 500 hours.

Apples

Apple Cox Orange Pippin Semi-Dwarf (mccyapcox15) *M-111* Old fashioned dessert apple: firm, juicy, sweet, rich flavor, not tart, distinctive aroma. Skin is orange-red to bright red over yellow. Prefers moderate climate. 800 hours. Self-fruitful.

Apple Gala Semi-Dwarf (mccyapgal15) *M111* Ripens mid-season. Skin is bright scarlet over yellow. Dense aromatic flesh with semi-sweet flavor. Upright tree with somewhat drooping branches. Good pollinizer for other apple varieties. 500-600 hours. Self-fruitful.

Apple Golden Delicious (Yellow Del.) Dwarf (mccyapgod15) *B-9* Medium to large yellow-skinned fruit, sometimes blushed pink. Crispy, firm, sweet and juicy fruit. Best all-purpose home garden apple for all cooking as well as fresh eating. Ripens in late September to early October. Self-fruitful as well as being a good pollen source for most other apples. 700 hours.

Apple Golden Delicious (Yellow Del.) S-D (mccyapgol15) *M-111* (fruit described above)

Apple Granny Smith S-D (mccyapgra7pp) *M111* From New Zealand. Large, late, green, all purpose. Crisp, tart, excellent keeper. Requires long summers and thrives in hot climates. 600 hours. Prolonged bloom, good pollinizer for other apples. Self-fruitful.

Apple Pink Lady Semi-Dwarf (mccyappnk15) *M111* New hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central CA, about 3 weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful. 400-500 hours.

Apple Red Fuji Dwarf (mccyaprej15) *B-9* Redder-skinned bud sport of Fuji. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central CA. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

Apple Red Fuji Semi-Dwarf (mccyapred15) *M111* (fruit described above)

Apricots

Autumn Glo Apricot Semi-Dwarf (mccyapaug15) *Citation* High quality fruit. Later bloom-

ing, later ripening than Blenheim (the better to avoid our spring rains ruining the blossoms). 500 hours.

Apricot Blenheim Semi-Dwarf (mccyapble)

Citation All-time favorite apricot for California, sets the standard for flavor. Best choice for all-around eating, cooking, drying, canning. Medium-sized fruit is pale orange with red freckles. Flesh is firm, aromatic, juicy-rich and sweet. Heavy crops ripen in mid-late June. An early bloomer and self-fruitful. 500 hours.

Apricot Blenheim Semi-Dwarf (mccyapble15)

Marianna 26-24 (fruit described above)

Apricot Moorpark Semi-Dwarf (mccyapmoo15)

Citation Long-time favorite of connoisseurs for its exceptionally rich flavor and aroma. Fruit is large to very large, with a deep yellow to orange skin, often freckled. Flesh is deep orange, juicy and sweet. Best use is for fresh eating, but can also be used for canning and drying. Fruit ripens in early to mid July, after Blenheim. Ripening can be a bit uneven, so wait until fruit is fully ripe before harvesting. Self-fruitful. 600 hours.

Asian Pears

Asian-Pear Hosui Semi-Dwarf (mccyashou15)

OHxF333 Large, top quality. Ripens in September, after 20th Century. Juicy, sweet, flavorful, refreshing, crisp like an apple. Brownish-orange skin. Pollinated by Shinko, Chojuro, Bartlett or 20th Century. 450 hours.

Asian-Pear Kikusui Standard (mccyaskik15)

Betulaefolia Juicy, sweet, crisp, yellow skinned fruit. Superb for fresh eating, one of the best. Easy to grow. Keeps well. Mid-August in Central California. Partly self-fruitful or pollinated by 20th Century and others. 450 hours.

Asian-Pear Shinko Semi-Dwarf (mccyasshi15)

OHxF333 Perhaps the best choice for anyone who can plant only one Asian Pear. Voted first in flavor and appearance in Sunset tests. Oval fruit with a russeted skin, very flavorful, juicy, sweet and tender. Refreshing crispness and fine texture. Allow to ripen on the tree, harvesting in early to mid-October. Somewhat self-fruitful, but bears better if pollinized by Hosui, Chojuro, Kikusui, or Bartlett. 450 hours.

Asian-Pear 20th Century Semi-Dwarf (mccyasywe15)

OHxF333 This 'pear-apple' combines the flavor and sweetness of a pear with the crispness and quality of an apple. These are best when tree-ripened. Because they are so perfect for fruit salads, pear-apples are often called 'salad pears'. Self-fruitful or pollinize with Bartlett or Shinseki. 450 hours.

Cherries

Cherry Bing Dwarf (mccychbin15) *GM 61/1*

The leading commercial variety. Large, heart-shaped

fruit is deep mahogany in color, firm, sweet, and very juicy. Ripens in early to mid June. Heavy bearer. Outstanding for all uses, fresh,

dried, juice, and canning. Requires a pollinizer such as Lapins or Craig's Crimson. 700 hours.

Cherry Craig's Crimson Semi-Dwarf (mccychra15)
Colt Taste test winner! Natural semi-dwarf, perhaps the finest sweet cherry: dark red to nearly black, medium to large size, wonderful spicy flavor, very firm texture. Mid-season. Self-fruitful. 800 hours.

Cherry Lapins (Self-fruitful Bing) Semi-Dwarf (mccychlap15)
Colt From Canada, dark red sweet cherry. Large, firm, good flavor. Ripens 4 days after Bing. Mid-season. Self-fruitful. 700 hours.

Cherry Montmorency Standard (mccychmon15)
Mazzard Large, light red skin, yellow flesh. Perfect for cobblers, pies, etc. Extremely winter hardy. Very heavy bearing. 700 hours. Self-fruitful.

Cherry Royal Rainier Standard (mccychror)
Mazzard Red blush over yellow. Crisp, sweet and flavorful. Self-fruitful but may bear even more heavily when pollinated by Craig's Crimson or Lapins. Mid-season harvest. 600 hours (note lower chill requirement!).

Figs

Black Jack (dwn9232) Large, purplish-brown figs with sweet, juicy strawberry-red flesh. Naturally small (semi-dwarf) tree. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

Black Mission (dwn9227) The favorite. Purplish-black skin, strawberry-colored flesh, rich flavor. Heavy bearing, long-lived, large tree. Good for fresh eating, drying or canning. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

Brown Turkey (dwn9233) Large, brown skin, pink flesh. Sweet, rich flavor, used fresh. Small tree, prune to any shape. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

Janice Seedless (dwn9252) New "white" fig. Large, sweet, delicious, light greenish-yellow fruit with practically no seeds. Prolonged harvest, August through November at Fremont, CA. Prune to any shape. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

Panache (dwn9229) Especially fine flavor. Small to medium-sized fruit with green color and yellow "tiger" stripes. Strawberry pulp is blood-red in color. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

Violette de Bordeaux (dwn9821) Purple skin with brilliant red flesh. Tastes like great raspberry jam; loaded with aroma, too.

Jujubes

Jujube Lang, Chinese Date (mccyjulan15)
Deciduous tree. Grows to 20-25 feet with an equal

spread. Small, yellowish-green to white flowers bloom in late spring, followed by 1-1/2" long x 3/4" wide pear-shaped, reddish-brown fruit which ripens in Sept.-Oct. Fruit is crisp and sweet with the taste of an apple when eaten fresh. It is often glazed, dried or canned. Requires a hot summer. Pollinated by Li. Low chilling requirement.

Jujube Li, Chinese Date (mccyjulii15) Deciduous tree. Grows moderately to 20-25 feet with an equal spread. Small, yellowish-green to white flowers bloom in late spring, followed by 2" long round mahogany-brown fruits which ripen in Sept.-Oct. Fruit is crisp, sweet, pithy with the taste of an apple when eaten fresh. It resembles a date when candied, glazed, dried or canned. Requires a long hot summer. Partly self-fruitful, but better yield when pollinated by Lang. Low chilling requirement.

Mulberries

Mulberry Pakistan Fruiting (mccymopak15)
Long (3"), firm, red to black, sweet blackberry-like fruit. Non-staining juice. Month-long early summer harvest. Fruit is used fresh and for pies, jams and jellies. Large, vigorous, disease-resistant tree. Self-fruitful.

Mulberry Persian Fruiting (mccymonig15x16)
Densely foliated, to 25-30 ft. Large heart-shaped leaves. Large syncarpous (like a blackberry) fruit is juicy, dark red to black, good for jam.

Nectarines

Nectarine Arctic Glo S-Dwarf (mccynearg)
Citation Exciting new sprightly-sweet, early season white-fleshed nectarine. High-scoring in taste tests: nice balance of sugar and acid, very appealing flavor. Highly recommended for home orchards. Late June/early July in Central CA. 600-700 hours. Self-fruitful.

Nectarine Arctic Jay S-Dwarf (mccyneaa)
Citation Taste test winner in repeated tastings year after year. Very attractive, firm, freestone fruit is richly flavored, with a balance of acid and sugar. Ripens between Arctic Glo and Heavenly White nectarines. 800 hours. Self-fruitful.

Nectarine Heavenly White S-D (mccynehes)
Citation New, superb white-fleshed freestone - a connoisseur's delight. Large fruit has a cream-colored skin deeply blushed with red. Flesh is freestone, white with a sweet, rich flavor. Peak quality when just soft-ripe. Ripens early August. Self-fruitful. 650 hours.

Nectarine Liz's Late Semi-Dwarf (mccyneliz15)
Citation Sprightly-sweet, intense, spicy flavor. Very high score in fruit tasting. Late August to early September in Central CA. 600-700 hours. Self-fruitful.

Nectarine Necta Zee Genetic Dwarf (mccynenec15) *Lovell* Sweet, very flavorful, yellow freestone, beautiful red skin. Mid-

June to early July in Central California. Strong, vigorous tree to 6 ft. Good in containers. Best self-fruitful miniature nectarine. 500 hours.

Nectarine Snow Queen Semi-Dwarf (mccynesnq)

Citation Sweet, juicy, early season white freestone. Late June harvest, 2-3 weeks ahead of 'Babcock' Peach. 250-300 hours.

Peaches

Peach Babcock Semi-Dwarf (mccypebab)

Citation Long-time favorite white-fleshed peach. Small to medium sized fruit has pale pink skin lightly blushed with red. White flesh is semi-freestone, soft, juicy, and mild, with a bit of tang. Fruit ripens mid to late June into July. Excellent for fresh eating, also can be cooked or frozen. Babcock is a heavy bearer so fruit should be thinned early in season to produce larger fruit. Self-fruitful. Low chilling requirement, 250-300 hours.

Peach Donut Semi-Dwarf (mccypedon15)

Citation Unique white-fleshed fruit with a sunken center. Sweet, with a mild flavor described by some as almond-like. Ripens late June/early July. 400-500 hours. Self-fruitful.

Peach Honey Babe Genetic Dwarf (Miniature)

(mccypehon15) *Lovell* Sweet, yellow freestone with rich peach flavor. Heavy bearing 5 ft tree. Early to mid-July in central California. Excellent choice for home gardens and for containers. Self-fruitful. 500 hours.

Peach July (Kim) Elberta Semi-Dwarf

(mccypejul) *Citation* AKA Early Elberta. Reliable, heavy crops. Juicy, sweet, very flavorful yellow fleshed fruit excellent for freezing, canning or fresh use. A good Elberta for the Santa Clara Valley. Self-fruitful. 500 hours.

Peach Loring Semi-Dwarf (mccypelor15)

Citation Taste-test winner. Superb large yellow freestone. Excellent flavor and texture, low acid. Harvests over two-to-three week period, mid to late July in Central California. Requires little or no thinning. Excellent for home orchard. Self-fruitful. 750 hours.

Peach O'Henry Semi-Dwarf (mccypeohe)

Citation Popular fresh-market, yellow freestone now available for home planting. Large, firm, full red skin, superb flavor. Ripens early to mid-August in Central California. Good for freezing. Strong, vigorous, heavy bearing tree. Self-fruitful. 750 hours.

Peach Snow Beauty Semi-Dwarf (mccypesnb)

Citation White-fleshed taste-test winner. Low acid, high sugar, tantalizing flavor. Large, very firm, attractive red skin. Early to mid-July. 750-800 hours. Self-fruitful.

Peach Strawberry Free Semi-Dwarf (mccypestf)

Citation Long-time favorite white freestone peach for CA. Very sweet, aromatic, juicy, with superb, delicate flavor. Early to mid July. Highly recommended for home orchards. Self-fruitful. 400-500 hours.

Pears

Pear Blake's Pride Standard (mccyprblp) *Winter*

Nelis Mid-season, ripening about 2 weeks after Bartlett. Fruit is medium-size, with an attractive yellow color and excellent aromatic flavor. Produces annual crops; fireblight-resistant.

Pear Harrow Delight Semi-Dwarf (mccyprhad15)

OHxF333 Fireblight-resistant, with fruit similar to Bartlett. Yellow skin with attractive red blush. Smooth, fine flesh is especially flavorful. Heavy-bearing tree. 800 hours. Interfruitful with Bartlett, Bosc and D'Anjou.

Pear Potomac Standard (mccyprpot) *Winter Nelis*

Fruit is moderate size, averaging 2 1/2". Flesh texture is moderately fine and buttery. Flavor is pleasingly sub-acid with mild aroma and is similar to Beurre D'Anjou in character. Resistant to fire blight.

Persimmons

Persimmon Fuyu (Jiro) (mccypsfoy15) *D Lotus*

The 'Apple Persimmon'. Medium size, flattened shape looks like a red-orange tomato. Firm, non-astringent flesh is eaten while crispy. Harvest in fall, fruit can hang on tree for many weeks. Good for fresh eating, sliced in fruit salads, dries well, and can be frozen. Hardy, attractive, and ornamental tree. Fall color is yellow. Practically pest-free, self-fruitful. 200 hours.

Persimmon Giant Fuyu (mccypsgfu15) *D Lotus*

Larger, less flat than Fuyu. Crunchy when ripe like Fuyu. Sweet, flavorful, non-astringent. Easy to grow. Fall harvest. 200 hours. Self-fruitful.

Persimmon Hachiya (mccypshac15) *D Lotus*

Large, deep orange-red, acorn-shaped fruit. Sweet and flavorful when very soft-ripe. This is the persimmon for baking and cooking, but soft-ripe fruit can also be eaten fresh or frozen. Fruit can be picked when hard, then ripened off the tree. Harvest in fall. Productive and ornamental tree. Self-fruitful, pest-free. 200 hrs.

Plums

Plum Beauty S-Dwf (mccyplbea) *Citation*

Sweet, flavorful plum, more widely adapted than Santa

Rosa. Red over yellow skin, amber flesh streaked red. Ripens June in Central California. Self-fruitful. 250 hours.

Plum Burgundy S-Dwf (mccyplbur7pp) *Citation* Maroon-colored skin and flesh, very sweet, with a small pit. Thought to be derived from Mariposa. Prolonged harvest, mid-July to mid-August. Very productive. Upright habit. Self-fruitful. 400 hrs.

Plum Emerald Beaut S-Dwf (mccycleme) *Citation* Highly rated in taste tests. Light green skin with orangy flesh. Ripening fruit becomes increasingly sweet while keeping crunchy. Holds on tree 2 months! Requires pollinizer - Beauty, Late Santa Rosa, Nubiana, Flavor King Pluot. 600-700 hours.

Plum Late Santa Rosa Semi-Dwarf (mccypllsr) *Citation* Medium to large reddish-purple skin, red-streaked amber flesh. Tart-sweet with rich flavor when fully ripe. 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

Plum Santa Rosa Semi-Dwarf (mccyplsan) *Citation* Most popular and widely grown plum in California. Large, round to oval fruit has a reddish-purple skin. Clingstone flesh is amber, tinged with red. Rich, sweet-but-tart flavor, astringent skin. Ripens mid June to early July. Excellent fresh eating plum, for canning or desserts. Self-fruitful. 300 hours.

Plum Satsuma Semi-Dwarf (mccyplsat15) *Citation* Second most popular plum in California. Medium-sized round fruit with a dark red skin. Meaty maroon flesh is sweet and mild, yet lively and not tart. Excellent for fresh eating, and for cooking and canning. Ripens late July to early August. Partially self-fruitful, but better crops if pollinized by Santa Rosa or Beauty. 300 hrs.

Plum Weeping Santa Rosa S-Dwarf (mccyplwsr15) *Marianna 26-24* Semi-dwarf tree grows to 8-10 feet tall with long graceful weeping branches, making it very ornamental in the garden. Fruit is similar to regular 'Santa Rosa' plum, but ripens 2 weeks later. Excellent eating and cooking quality. Attractive white flowers in spring and weeping habit make it a beautiful landscape tree. It can also be espaliered. Self-fruitful. 400 hrs.

Pluots

Pluot Dapple Dandy Standard (mccypluda15) *Myro 29-C* Exquisite new fruit is a plum/apricot hybrid. Freestone. Flesh is creamy white with red highlights, with a wonderful plum/apricot flavor. Highly rated at fruit tastings. Skin turns from greenish-yellow with red spots to maroon and yellow dapple as it ripens. Ripens August. Pollinate with 'Flavor Supreme' Pluot or 'Santa Rosa' Plum. 400-500 hours.

Pluot Flavor Grenade Standard (mccyplufg15) *Myro 29-C* Elongated green fruit with a red blush. Crisp texture and explosive flavor. Taste-test winner. Hangs on the tree for 4 - 6 wks. Pollinate with a Japanese plum. 500-600 hours.

Pluot Flavor King Standard (mccyplufk15) *Myro 29-C* Very sweet, pleasing flavor with a little tartness. Medium-sized reddish fruit with a distinctive flavor. Prolonged harvest begins in mid-August, ripe fruit holds well on tree. A taste test winner! Pollinate with another pluot or Santa Rosa Plum. 500-600 hours.

Pluot Flavor Queen Standard (mccyplufq15) *Myro 29-C* Very sweet, wonderfully pleasing flavor with little to no tartness. Medium-sized greenish-yellow skinned fruit has the orange flesh and sweet flavor of an apricot. Prolonged harvest season begins in mid-July, continues through August. Pollinate with another pluot or Santa Rosa Plum. 500-600 hours.

Pomegranates

Pomegranate Ambrosia (dwn9591, mccypoamb) After third or fourth crop, HUGE fruit: twice the size of 'Wonderful'. Pink skin, purple sweet-tart juice, similar to 'Wonderful'. Adaptable. 150 hours. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Eversweet (dwn9590, mccypoeve) Very sweet, virtually seedless fruit. Red skin, clear (non-staining) juice. Harvest late summer through fall. 8 - 10 ft. arching shrub, or train as tree or espalier.

Pomegranate Garnet Sash (dwn9255) This small-fruited pomegranate is very tasty. It grows on a small plant, and also goes by the name 'Elf'. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Granada (dwn9258) Bud sport of 'Wonderful', which it resembles in tree form. Fruit resembles 'Wonderful', but has a red crown even while green. Ripe fruit is darker red and less tart. Can be shaped to bush or tree form. Self-fruitful. 150-200 hours.

Pomegranate Kashmir (dwn9253) Medium pomegranate with a somewhat tart flavor. Good acid and sugar balance. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Pink Satin (dwn9256) Attractive pomegranate has a refreshing flavor and edible seeds. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Red Silk (dwn9254) Medium to large size fruit with a pinkish-red exterior. Firm, yet edible seeds have a sweet berry flavor and a great acid/sugar balance. Naturally semi-dwarf tree sets large crops. Eat fresh or use in cooking. 150-200 hours. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Sharp Velvet (dwn9257) Large pomegranate with an appealing, unique flavor. Fruit has a dark red exterior and seeds. Upright growing tree sets huge crops of highly ornamental fruit. Eat fresh or use in cooking. An excellent source of antioxidants. 150-200 hours. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranate Sweet (dwn9602, mccyposwe)

Sweeter fruit than 'Wonderful', more widely adapted. Small, glossy-leaved, ornamental tree with showy orange-red blossoms in late spring. Very suitable to espalier and container growing. Harvest late summer. Unsplit ripe fruit stores in cool, dry place for two months or more. Self-fruitful. 100 hours.

Pomegranate Wonderful (dwn9692, mccypowon)

Showy single orange-red flowers (up to 4" across) bloom in summer followed by large, flavorful, red juicy-seeded fruit in fall. Grows to a 10 foot high fountain-shaped shrub or with training, as a tree or espalier. Fine for containers or can be used as a showy, quick screening shrub. Self-fruitful. 150 hours.

Prunes**Prune French Improved Standard (mccyprfre15)**

Marianna 26-24 Selected variety of plum with extra-high sugar content. California's leading commercial prune. Medium-sized oval fruit with dark blue skin. Freestone flesh is dark amber. Very rich, juicy, and sweet. Ripens in late August to September. Good for fresh eating, cooking and drying. Self-fruitful. 800 hours.

Prune Italian Semi-Dwarf (mccyprita15) Citation

Large purple-skinned freestone. Rich flavor, very sweet when fully ripe. Excellent fresh, dried or canned. Vigorous tree. Late summer harvest. Self-fruitful. 800 hours.

Multiple Graft Fruit Trees

These trees offer the advantages of longer, more varied and more manageable harvests in the space of one tree. Prune to keep one graft from dominating or allow your favorite to rule.

Apple 4n1 Fuji, Gala, Golden Delicious, Granny

Smith S-D (mccyap4n17) M111 *Fuji*: Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. *Gala, Golden Delicious, Granny Smith*: (all described previously)

Apple 6n1 Espaliered Apple - Golden Delicious, Fuji, Gala, Red Delicious, Braeburn, Gravenstein

S-D (m6n1mcc7e) M-7 Will have 3 tiers of branches with the following 6 varieties. *Golden Delicious, Fuji, Gala, Red Delicious* (all described previously) plus: *Braeburn*: Very crisp, tangy, late season apple from New Zealand, green with a red blush. Self-fruitful. 700 hours, and *Gravenstein*: famous for sauce and baking -crisp, juicy, flavorful and tart. 700 hours.

Asian-Pear 4n1 Semi-Dwarf #1 (mccyas4n1)

OHxF333 Hosui, Shinko, 20th Century: (all described previously) *Seigyoku*: Large fruit, smooth yellow skin. Crispy, juicy, sweet, flavorful. 500 hours.

Asian-Pear 4n1 Semi-Dwarf #2 (mccyas4na15)

OHxF333 Shinseiki, Kikusui: (both described previously). *Chojuro*: Russeted golden brown skin. Crisp like an apple when ripe. Harvest August. 450 hours. *Ishiwase*: Large, greenish-brown russeted skin, juicy, sweet, flavorful. 450 hours.

Cherry 4n1 Dwarf (pcsd4n1mc7pp) GM61/1

Bing, Lapins (both described previously), *Black Tartarian*: small-to-medium sized fruit is purplish black. Early and heavy bearer. *Van*: Dark, sweet fruit, very cold hardy, reliable, heavy bearing. Similar to Bing, although slightly smaller. 700 hours.

'Fruit Salad' 4n1 Standard #1 (mccyfr4n115) Lovell

Will have 4 of the following 5 varieties: *July Elberta Peach, Blenheim Apricot* (both described previously), *Late Santa Rosa Plum*: Medium to large reddish-purple skin, red-streaked amber flesh. Tart-sweet with rich flavor when fully ripe. Harvest about one month after Santa Rosa. 500 hrs. *Gold Dust Peach*: best early season yellow peach, all-purpose, superb for eating fresh. *Independence Nectarine*: bright, red skin; rich flavor, tangy and sweet, one of the best.

'Fruit Salad' 4n1 Standard #2 (dwn5563) Nemaguard

Will have 4 of the following 5 varieties: *July Elberta Peach, Babcock Peach, Fantasia Nectarine, Blenheim Apricot, Santa Rosa Plum* (all described previously) **Nectarine/Peach 4n1 (All White-fleshed varieties) Standard (ppn3n1mcc7pp) Lovell** Has 4 of the following 5 varieties: *Heavenly White Nectarine, Arctic Supreme Peach, Babcock Peach* (all described previously), *Arctic Rose Nectarine*: delicious, super-sweet, white flesh. Rich flavor. *White Lady Peach*: Among the best of the new white peaches. Large, red-skinned, firm freestone. 600-800 hours

Peach 4n1 Standard (mccpe4n1157) Lovell

Will have 4 out of the following 5 varieties: *Strawberry Free, Babcock, July Elberta* (all described previously), *Gold Dust*: Best early season yellow peach. All-purpose, superb for eating fresh. *Scarlet Robe*: Highly regarded yellow freestone. Superb flavor and texture. Resists brown rot.

Plum 4n1 Semi-Dwarf (mccypl4n1157) Citation

Will have 4 grafts out of the following 5 varieties: *Beauty Sweet, flavorful plum, more widely adapted than Santa Rosa. Red over yellow skin, amber flesh streaked red. Ripens June in central California. Self-fruitful. 250 hours., Elephant Heart* - Large, heart shaped fruit with sweet, juicy, richly flavored red flesh. Dark reddish purple mottled skin. Heavy bearing. Long harvest season in September. 500 hours. *Laroda*: High scoring in taste tests. Dark purple skinned with juicy, flavorful red

and amber flesh. Prolonged harvest late July to late August. 400 hours. Late Santa Rosa: (described previously), Nubiana: Purplish-black skin, amber flesh. Large, firm, flattened shape. Sweet, flavorful, some tartness at skin or pit. Excellent for home orchard. Late July. 500 hours. **Pluot 4n1 Semi-Dwarf (mccyplu41157)** *Citation* Dapple Dandy, Flavor King, Flavor Queen (all described previously), Flavor Supreme: Sweet and flavorful with little to no tartness. Large fruit has maroon-green mottled skin with meaty red flesh like a good plum. Superb early season fruit, harvest begins in mid to late June. 500-600 hours.

Description of Rootstocks

We choose rootstock varieties not for their dwarfing abilities so much as for their tendencies to establish well in our soils and induce early bearing. All trees can be kept under 8 feet with summer pruning. We recommend employing the techniques described in our FREE Backyard Orchard Guide for effective size control.

Betulaefolia Used on Asian Pears. Unpruned tree height of 15 - 25 ft (standard size). Tolerant of wet soil, dry soil and alkaline soil. Resists pear decline. Trees are vigorous.

B-9 Dwarfing to 1/3 of standard. Approx. height to 10 feet, width of 6 feet. Resistant to phytophthora. Excellent cold hardiness. Produces large fruit. Supports heavy crops. Good choice for heavy soils.

Citation Will keep peaches and nectarines dwarfed to 8 - 14 feet, apricots and plums dwarfed to 12 - 18 feet. Tolerates wet soils, is not drought tolerant. Resists root-knot nematodes. Induces early bearing (sometimes in the first year).

Colt In heavy soils, standard cherry varieties on Colt are dwarfed to about 3/4 of standard, or about 22-30 feet, if not pruned. Lesser dwarfing effect in other soils. Relatively tolerant of wet soil, apparently resistant to bacterial canker. Trees begin bearing at young age.

D Lotus Persimmon trees will grow 12 to 25 feet high (standard size). Can be kept smaller with pruning.

GM 61/1 Standard cherry trees are reduced to approximately 1/2 size (15 to 20 feet). Relatively tolerant of wet soil. Produces early with heavy crops. One of the very best true dwarf rootstocks.

Lovell Standard rootstock used on peaches, nectarines, apricots, plums, almonds (keeping them at their standard height of 15 to 25 feet high). Also used on genetic dwarf trees keeping them at their standard height of 3

to 6 feet tall. Tolerant of wet soils.

M-111 Excellent all-around rootstock for apples. Unpruned tree height 80-90% of standard, or about 15-25 ft. Tolerates wet soil, dry soil, poor soil. Resists wooly apple aphids and collar rot. Induces bearing at young age.

M-7 For Apples. Unpruned tree height 2/3 of standard or 12-20 feet. Induces early and heavy bearing. Resists fireblight and powdery mildew. Moderately resistant to collar rot. Good anchorage. Widely adapted.

Marianna 26-24 Used on apricots, plums and almonds. Unpruned mature trees will be small, 15 to 20 feet high (semi-dwarf size). Very tolerant of wet soils, resistant to oak root fungus and root-knot nematodes.

Mazzard Cherries on Mazzard are vigorous (standard size 30-40 ft) and more tolerant of wet soils. Resistant to root-knot nematodes and oak root fungus.

Myrobalan 29C Used on plums and pluots for shallow but vigorous root systems. Unpruned trees will be 15 to 25 feet (standard size). Tolerates wet soils. Is immune to root nematodes, and has some resistance to oak root fungus. Widely adapted.

Nemaguard Peach rootstock used for peaches, nectarines and apricots. Produces vigorous standard sized trees resistant to root knot nematodes.

OHxF333 Best dwarfing rootstock for pears and Asian pears. Yields a semi-dwarf tree 15 to 18 feet high. Promotes early and heavy fruit production. Resistant to pear decline and firelightb.

Winter Nelis For European and hybrid pears. Vigorous, relatively tolerant of wet soils. Resistant to oak-root fungus. Long-lived trees reach 20-25 feet.



Planting 2,3 or 4 trees in 1 hole ensures pollination, and a longer, more varied harvest in the space of 1 tree.
