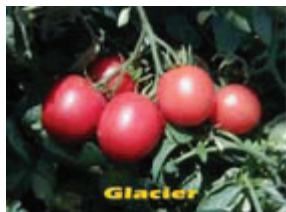


# Steve Goto's 2007 Cool Season Tomatoes



**Galina Cherry** 59 days. Indeterminate variety from Siberia. Arguably our most flavorful tomato. Galina was chosen one of the 10 best early tomatoes by Organic Gardening Magazine. Many round yellow 1" cherry tomatoes on each vigorous plant. Great cool season yellow cherry variety.



**Glacier** 63 days. Semi-indeterminate. Extremely early, cold-tolerant, high-yielding special strain of tomato plant. Begins flowering when only 4" high and bears tasty tomatoes only 45 days from flowering. Above average yields of 2 to 3 oz sized fruits with outstanding flavor for such an early tomato.



**Mother Russia** 72 days. Indeterminate from Siberia. Fitting for a tomato named mother Russia, these large, flavorful pink tomatoes ripen in the shape of a perfect heart. Dense, meaty, 4", 10-12 oz. fruits.



**Siberia** 48 days. Determinate. Very early variety. A Russian Traveler supposedly smuggled out this seed in 1975 and gave it to a greenhouse operator in Canada. This tomato is capable of setting fruit at 38 degrees on sturdy, dark green plants. Bright red fruits, 3 oz to 5 oz. Grow in clusters of 30 or more on small bushy plants. Most popular variety today in Alaska.



**Stupice** 52 days. Indeterminate. A native of Czechoslovakia, where its extreme earliness, tolerance to cold, superior flavor and very high yields have earned it worldwide attention. Tests have shown an astounding average of 87 fruits picked per plant- 1 to 2 ounces in weight and very sweet. One of the best all around productive tomato on the market today.



**Taxi** 65-70 days. Determinate. This attractive bright yellow tomato is very popular. The round 4 oz to 6 oz yellow fruit have a distinctive sweet flavor and are less acidic than red tomatoes. Plants grow to about 2' and yield heavily for a month. The best yellow tomato for cool season growing.

Note: Determinate means bush form, indeterminate means vine form.
